

Admission Policy

Brighton Primary School

Purpose

The Admission process for enrolment at Brighton Primary School will provide:

- An opportunity for students, living within the school boundary/zone to attend Brighton Primary regardless of gender, race or disability.
- An efficient process of enrolment that satisfies the needs of both the students and the school.

Guidelines

- Admittance to the school will follow the principles of the Bill of Rights, Victorian Government entry requirements and the Brighton Primary nearest neighbourhood boundary
- Hearing impaired students will be enrolled into the special facility regardless of zone boundaries. Once enrolled, siblings will be automatically accepted
- Siblings of students who are enrolled at the school will also be accepted
- International students will be enrolled according to the requirements of the International Studies Unit
- On admission, parents will complete an enrolment form providing personal, social, medical and academic details and will receive a school information pack
- Out of zone enrolments are contingent on vacancies within the year level, if there are no vacancies, offer of a place will not be made
- Students from overseas and interstate will be assessed prior to admission, to determine the appropriate Grade level.
- Students will be allocated to classes according to school and student needs.
- Once admitted to the school students will be made welcome and teamed up with a buddy.
- Students with English as a second language (EAL) will be supported in the classroom literacy program

Implementation

Tours of the school will be conducted by the principal for interested families.

All enrolments will require the completion of the DEECD 'Confidential Student Information Enrolment Form', with details entered immediately on CASES. The information provided includes:

- date of birth (note: evidence of date of birth can be official, such as a birth certificate or where this is not able to be produced, unofficial, such as a doctor's note attesting to a child's age).
- names and addresses of the student and enrolling parent or guardian
- details of medical and other conditions that may require special consideration
- emergency telephone numbers, including a nominated doctor
- the name of the previous school and the student's current year level, where students transfer from another school

Once enrolled, families will receive a letter of confirmation and a school brochure.

- A child who is less than the minimum age of entry for Victorian schools but has transferred from an interstate school is eligible for enrolment. Evidence of age and full-time enrolment at the interstate or overseas school must be provided. Information regarding the enrolment of overseas students can be obtained from the International Studies Unit
- Students with disabilities and/or impairments are enrolled along with all other eligible children. Delayed admissions can only be authorised by the Regional Director.
- Early Childhood Centres will complete a transition form for students transitioning to primary school
- Students new to school during the year can commence once they have met their teacher and have purchased their school uniform. This will be arranged through the front office.
