STUDENTS TAKING ACTION!

Milla (3C) and Ollie (5B) love the gorillas and are taking action to help the Royal Melbourne Zoo protect them and their habitats. Over the holidays please take the opportunity to search your cupboards for any old phones or tablets lying around your house and send them to school for recycling.

Did you know ... ?

Your mobile phone may contain a mineral called coltan. Coltan is mined in locations including critical habitat for Eastern Lowland Gorillas in Central Africa. The threats gorillas face as a result of mining include:

- Deforestation – Mining leads to habitat loss and habitat fragmentation, reducing areas where gorillas can survive.
- As a result of habitat loss, gorillas come into contact more frequently with humans, increasing likelihood of competition for space or resources.
- Disease – With increased human activity, gorillas have increased exposure to human illnesses, such as the flu, some of which can be fatal.

When you recycle your phones there are a number of environmental benefits:

- Your phone will be saved from landfill, with some or all components able to be recycled or re-used.
- By recycling through this program, you also raise important funds for gorilla conservation. This program supports the Gorilla Doctors, which helps treat ill and injured gorillas in Africa.

SUNSMART - REMINDER

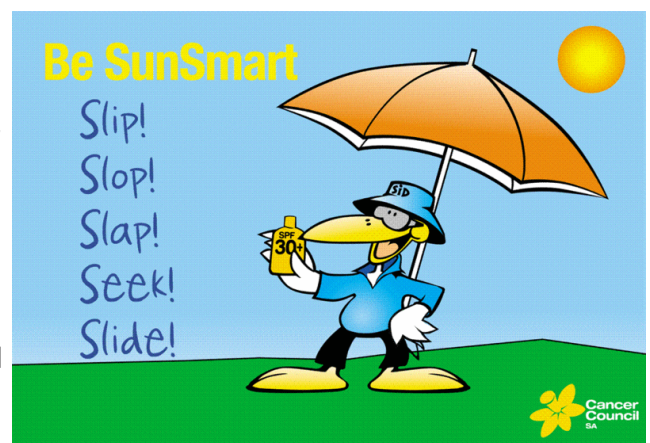
In accordance with our school Sun Smart Policy students must wear a hat to school from September.

SunSmart recommends SPF30 or higher broad spectrum, water resistant sunscreen be applied to any skin not covered by clothing.

Our school will be implementing strategies to help remind students to apply sunscreen before heading outdoors. This includes recess, lunch and outdoor learning activities such as PE lessons. Students who do not have a hat will be asked to move into a shaded area.

Please help support this initiative by:

- ◆ Supplying your child with SPF30 or higher, broad-spectrum, water-resistant sunscreen for use during school hours.
- ◆ Talking to your child about the importance of using sunscreen regularly to help prevent skin damage and skin cancer.
- ◆ Ensuring your child knows how to apply their sunscreen independently and has had some practise so they will be all set to apply it safely at school.
- ◆ Being a SunSmart role model at home with sunscreen, hats, clothing, shade and sunglasses.



We also remind parents to provide sunscreen for their child – we advise sunscreen be applied during the day before children go outdoors. If your child has their own sunscreen in their bag it helps protect them during the warmer weather.

Let's promote SunSmart practices and keep our children safe!

Why is it important to have access to clean, fresh water?

Luke: It is important because not all countries have clean, fresh water like Australia. It is essential to human life and people can't live without it. You need water for anything and everything.

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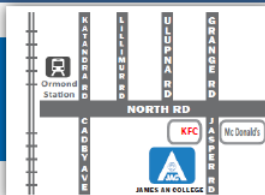
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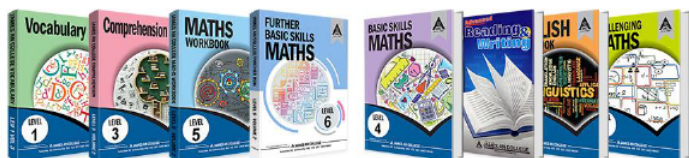

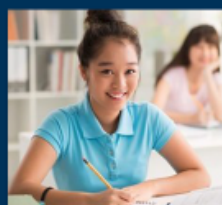
